OCTOBER RESIDENTIAL TRIP



On Wednesday 30 November the Club was delighted to celebrate its 156th birthday. St Andrew's is the oldest Youth Club in the world, and we are proud to continue that legacy into the future.

Our birthday coincided with a Royal visit, which really helped mark this special occasion. This was the first in-person visit to a youth club for HRH The Earl of Wessex, now The Duke of Edinburgh, since taking over the patronage of charity London Youth from his late father, Prince Philip. Members were able to discuss with Prince Edward what they enjoy about the Club and their thoughts on the role it plays in the community. Prince Edward was given a tour of the building, which had been opened by his late father in 1984, and seemed to particularly enjoy the gym, the music suite and playing table football. He joined in a graffiti session with the Members, run by Youth Worker Adrian, and later stated that he had thoroughly enjoyed his time with us.

We are grateful to Prince Edward, who is a champion of youth causes and leading advocate of the role of non-formal education in young people's personal development, for recognising the work done by St. Andrew's. Our rich history is a testament to the dedication and hard work of our Members and staff, and we look forward to continuing to make a positive impact in the future.
