This year, London has experienced particularly tragic levels of youth violence. The Youth Violence Commission July report pinpoints **youth clubs** as part of the solution. St Andrew's Club has always believed 'prevention is better than cure.' Interview with Louise Hawes, former member and long-standing youth worker, by John Rhodes, trustee

Leading the way for girls at St Andrew's

In 1981 Louise Hawes was one of the few girl members at St Andrew's. Although only age nine, she could be confident that she would be able to look after herself. Not least because her father, John, who sadly died recently, was a keen boxer at the Club. And her mother, Brenda, volunteered on reception for 25 years.

Louise particularly loved going on the activity weekends at Woodrow; a country house youth centre, just north of London. "The countryside was a world away from the Peabody estate." The Club provided other opportunities to expand her world. Pony trekking in Wales, and visits to Paris and Spain. Cost, fewer weekend volunteers and health and safety concerns have made such outings so much more difficult. But Louise's close involvement with St Andrew's is as strong as ever.

From being a youth helper, she joined the staff working three nights a week at the Club. She started activities that would

attract girls to follow her into joining. She is delighted that "there now seem to just as many girls as boys," and also that girls are now the minority in her cookery classes.

Despite now having two boys and moving to Epsom. Louise

still runs the Wednesday evening cookery session. She loves the new kitchen gifted to the Club by a generous local company and two grant-giving trusts. But she's clear that it's the community and providing a safe place for our members that has kept her coming to the Club for the last 37 years. Visit our website News for more of Louise's pictures.
