Paul Whittle gives a rare interview to talk about his over 40 years at St Andrew's Club

Paul comes from a large family with roots in Pimlico reaching back to the nineteenth century. He recalls that families were poor, but looked after each other. He is rightly proud that the Club he has managed for over 30 years helps to maintain the spirit and soul of the local community.

A member aged 10, and appointed manager in his 20s, Paul is particularly keen to help young members take on responsibilities and new challenges in the Club. He is determined that the Club is 'a nurturing and caring place that provides all sorts of opportunities.' He is pleased members have achieved high awards in karate and snowboarding, as well as football. But he is clearly just as proud that an autistic child has found a sense of belonging in the Club.

The Club has changed a lot under Paul's leadership; responding to changes in its members' world. Opportunities have increased; but drugs have become more of a challenge and social media bullying was unthought of in the 1980s. Paul's team and the Club's activities are all directed towards helping 700+ members make the most of the opportunities and robustly address the challenges. Why we are more than just a youth club - members' achievements

Over the last ten years St Andrew's Club has sent over 100 members on the Snow-Camp apprenticeship training, with over half of them becoming ambassadors for the programme. Our Youth Work Development Programme offers not only skill development and experience in the snow sport industry, but enables members to grow in confidence and self-esteem, develop as individuals and make positive choices for their lives. Hamza, our current Club Member of the Year, has flourished on his apprenticeship with Snow-Camp and is currently working on a year's placement at the Snow Dome in Milton Keynes.

In addition to funding members with Snow-Camp apprenticeships, we provide learning and training for older members who want to gain hands-on work experiences. Our Youth Work Development Programme offers opportunities for members aged 16 upwards to volunteer one evening each week to develop their practical skills. Guided by our paid youth work leaders, members, such as Dedan, who is employed by the Club as an assistant graffiti tutor and was recently taken on at Hamley's, can progress to paid junior staff through to full-time youth worker. The youth programme empowers members: they feel motivated in applying for jobs; more confident to take up a position of responsibility as well as developing their understanding of the world of work.

"The youth volunteering programme has helped me improve my confidence and socialising with younger people. I also feel like there is more I can benefit from by working here" says Dedan.



"Snow-Camp has changed my life; I have made many new friends and found out that I had a talent which I would never have known about. By continuing my journey with Snow-Camp through the apprenticeship I will be able to give back to the charity by teaching others exactly what I was taught by the other apprentices and staff. All this was made possible by my involvement with St Andrew's" says Hamza.
