We think that what the Club offers its members and the local community is priceless: building self-confidence, respect for themselves and for others, whilst giving these young people a safe, secure and supervised place to come. They develop vital skills and experience opportunities to build a positive sense of citizenship. Many of our members live locally and come from homes on very tight budgets. Here are some of our recent highlights, with an introduction by Ella-Mei, Club Member of the year 2017/18:

"I have been coming to St Andrew's since I was five. I am now 16 so the Club has been part of my childhood. My Mum came to the Club when she was young, as did my older sister and my younger brother is still here. I was so happy when I was made Club Member of the Year. This Club means so much to me and it's a real privilege to be able to hold a senior role. I hold a weekly 'Meet the Club Rep' surgery and members tell me what they like or don't like. We are planning to do our own fundraising to help the Club. Last year I volunteered at Junior Club, and this year I am a paid part-time youth worker. Putting this on my CV has helped me get a part-time job at the local GAP. I hope the Club is here for the next generation of young people as I can't imagine a childhood without it".

Ella-Mei's Tuesday surgeries provide a chance for members to discuss Club life. Thoughts and ideas can be passed on to management committee meetings.

To complement our newly funded Apple MacBook Airs, former Club member, Chris, gave a workshop to teach new skills.

Boxing coach Abdul runs two sessions each week for all ages. Boxing is a great way to keep fit and have fun.

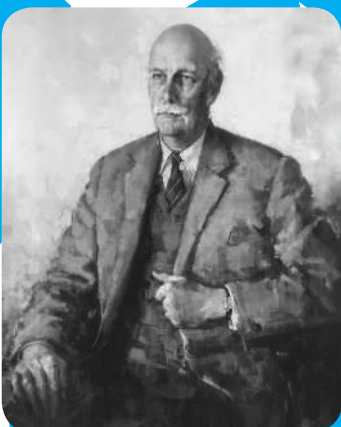

Interview with Linda Llewellyn, former member, by John Rhodes, trustee

Linda's Thursday nights in the '60s.



Linda aged 13 in 1969

During the day, Linda Llewellyn is the first person most people see when they come into St Andrew's. Few will know that this welcoming face first came to the Club some 50 years ago, in her early teens, slipping into the Thursday disco in her favourite pink angora mini-dress.

Punctuating memories with her infectious laugh, Linda recalls the essential elements of a Thursday evening. Sprinting from home immediately after 'Top of the Pops'; 'frothy coffee' at the Strutton Ground Wimpy; and arriving at the Club in Great Peter Street with her best friend, Jackie, in time to "snag a decent boy to dance with". Someone played '45s' on the record player in the coffee bar, and tissue paper hanging from lampshades completed the 'disco' scene.

Wednesday evening's phone calls agreed what to wear. "You always stuck together. So had to avoid colour clashes like red and purple. A disaster!" Linda's own favourites, after the pink angora, were 'red' and 'bottle green'. But it's also worth asking her sometime about the 'Apricot and Aqua' chiffon dress she once skipped school for...

There are other teenage memories. The baked potato and fire brigade incident; the 'Blue Beat' trips to Brixton; the plans to become a croupier; the Club's annual 30 mile fundraising walk; and borrowing a Routemaster - with driver - for the evening.

"We were passionate about everything. Discos with my friend Jackie were safe, but the Club gave us our freedom".
