


COVID MEMORIAL BENCHES

Through hard work and creativity, they were able to capture this challenging period in their lives, using it as the inspiration to create colourful and hopeful memorial benches.

The benches are currently on display at the National Memorial Arboretum until the start of October, when they will be returned to the Club. We hope that by sharing our benches with the public, it will inspire others to reflect on their own lockdown experiences.

From 24 July to 18 August, St Andrew's ran our fantastic four-week Summer Project. The Summer Project helped children stay active, positive, and motivated throughout the summer. It provided respite to parents and carers at what can be an expensive and stressful time of year.

The fun-filled programme included opportunities for young people to gain practical skills, such as learning how to make their own fan-powered cars. They explored their creativity by designing their own bags and t-shirts and enjoyed weekly graffiti artwork sessions. Children's well-being was supported, as they learnt how to make stress balls and took part in hair maintenance and self-care classes. They were kept active and healthy with daily sporting activities including football, archery and cricket.



There was a range of incredible trips for young people at the Club to enjoy. Including a visit to London Zoo where children got to meet some exotic animals. A trip on Paddington Canal on board the Floating Classroom, where they learnt about nature while exploring London's waterways by boat. Thrill seeking outings to Oxygen Trampoline park, Laser Tag and the ever popular Thorpe Park, where they enjoyed waterslides and rollercoasters.

These are just some of the highlights from an incredible summer at St Andrew's. The Club provided young people with amazing experiences and opportunities that they might have been deprived of without the Club. This is especially important with many families facing financial uncertainty.

Extract from an article written by former Member and current Vice President Barry Walsh


